OET Mock Test – Medicine

Setting: Suburban clinic

Patient: You are a 30 years old patient who has come to the doctor with the complaint of red eyes. Your eyes become red, itchy, and swollen by mid-day since last week. You do not use any lenses. You have tried over-the-counter eye drops but they were of no use.

Task:

- Tell the doctor about your main concern of red itchy eyes Find out the cause.
- Explain that your work requires long hours in front of the desktop. Get worried that you can't leave your work if it is because of the screen time.
- Express concern that it will affect your vision. You don't like wearing glasses.
- Do not get satisfied with the treatment and ask for something to give you relief quickly.
- Finally agree with the treatment and the precautions.

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Doctor: A 30-year-old patient presents to you with red, swollen, and itchy eyes. You take the history of any use of contact lenses or over-the-counter drugs. Your patient is an accountant and his work requires long hours of screen time

- Ask the patient what their main concern is regarding their health condition.
- Tell the patient that either it could be viral or due to excessive use of the desktop during work.
- Ask the patient to take frequent breaks from work and limit screen time.
- Reassure the patient that there will be no long-term damage to their eyesight and that wearing glasses may be helpful in preventing further harm.
- Explain to the patient that you will prescribe some eye drops and the use of protective glasses until the condition settle down.

- Encourage the patient to be patient and not expect immediate relief from the treatment
